



Environmental Policy Statement

1. An environmental management system is maintained to meet the requirements of BSI ISO 14001. Specific environmental objectives and targets are set by the Environmental Management Programme. This policy statement is a public document.
2. Gleaner ensures that operations comply with the appropriate legislation by subscribing to the publications which provide recognized interpretations of relevant legislation and by granting access to all reference documents to all managers. Local regulations are interpreted with the relevant local authority.
3. Personnel are supplied with training, equipment and documented procedures to minimize environmental effects of normal practice and the risk of accidents and incidents.
4. The purpose of the environmental management system is to prevent pollution and provide the means to continually improve the environmental impact of Gleaner's activities.
5. Management support their staff with leadership, encouragement and training to Investors in People standards. They implement continual improvements where possible and improve understanding of the environmental management system.
6. All records with the exception of those which may compromise products security or provide confidential financial information are made available to all company staff, customers and other interested third parties.
7. The efficiency of the distribution service is monitored to ensure that road tanker vehicle emissions are minimized. The use, type and maintenance of other vehicles use by Gleaner will be controlled to minimize total emissions, (e.g. high mileage users will be issued with diesel powered cars).
8. Boiler maintenance engineers are provided with the equipment, training and information to ensure that customers' appliances are maintained to manufacturer's specification. Equipment hired out by Gleaners will be maintained to ensure that they operate within manufacturer's specifications
9. Operations are developed to minimize the production of waste. Waste control procedures reduce risk to the environment. Waste generated by Gleaner's operations (e.g. boiler maintenance) will be collected and disposed of according to regulatory requirements.
10. Selection of suppliers of products and services (with the exception of Shell UK Oil) is based on their environmental policies, comparative quality and price. Products are selected to minimize adverse environmental effects where that does not entail excessive cost.
11. An emergency response plan which establishes responsibilities, contact points, and use of specialised equipment is maintained to deal with damage from accidental leaks or spillage of petroleum products.
12. The energy consumption of services such as pumps, heating and lighting will be reduced if possible when replacing or upgrading plant, equipment and buildings. The selection of suitable methods of reducing energy consumption will be based on repayment of investment by cost savings over 7 years.
13. As a company who operate in one of the most attractive and natural environments in the UK we are aware that our environmental assets must be protected and managed with total commitment. Properties under Gleaner's control are maintained to compliment their surroundings. We see our responsibility not just in the present but to undertake environmental improvements and to monitor and audit our endeavour for the benefit of others in years to come.
